1. Updates on projects (Dennis)

a. Reseal/stripe and other projects *this summer*

- i. Bren Circle to Library near Broida
 - ii. Repaving and restriping of underpass near Rec Cen to restriped area on path near Rob Gym
 - iii. Relocate bike lot from Life Sciences to median adjacent to new path
 - iv. SRB master plan and design under development
 - v. Library south lot will be reracked with peak racks
 - vi. Psych circle northerly entrance will be repaved and light pole removed
 - vii. Permanent parking lot on east side of Library – library commits to funds and is looking to close out ASAP
 - viii. Broida lot turn striping repave and restripe

G. DISCUSSION ITEMS

1. Bike Abatement

a. Process

- i. Bike must be obviously abandoned – look for signs (lost wheel, broken, etc.)
- ii. Once it has been tagged as abandoned legally at least 30 days to impound
- iii. CSO's tag abandoned bikes around campus based off respective judgement
- iv. Jin – rusted chains, lugs, dust, leaves, cobwebs are indicators of abandonment
- v. Freeman – Impounded bikes are stored at Devereux facility – capacity is near full

- vi. Freeman – CSO's can only sell 50-80 each bike sale so inflow is greater
 - vii. Jamie – De minimis value property – If bike "value" is less than \$50 CSO has autonomy to do what they want
 - viii. Bici Centro – intakes bikes from Isla Vista housing impoundment
- b. What are the limitations? Limited space or high labor cost?
- i. Bike sale cannot bring on more than five or six CSO officers – not cost efficient and lack of tablets to register
 - ii. Takes hours to transport bikes back and forth from Devereux to Bike Sale site
 - iii. Bowman – if CSO impounds bike that someone claims was parked legally this becomes a liability issue – CSO sometimes accused of stealing bikes
 - iv. Freeman – Tagging and impounding bikes are a "specialty" skill set by only about a third of the CSO's
 - v. Cutting bike locks takes a lot of power, more capacity needed
- c. Solutions
- i. Bowman – widespread tagging service rather than strictly CSO
 - ii. Sarah – nonprofits to come on campus and conduct business mandates liability and insurance compliance
 - iii. Jin – more logical to focus resources on impounding bikes to free up lots than simply buying more peak racks
 - iv. Whelan – Campbell and Bus Loop lots should be prioritized
 - v. Bowman – Talk with UCPD and CSO's to figure out plan moving forward and how Bike Committee can help
 - vi. RHA cuts locks on abandoned bikes and CSO's impound them
 - vii. Zip tying could be more effective as an abandonment tag so it cannot be easily ripped off
 - viii. Bowman – mandated to do things that are unpopular to students
 - ix. Bowman – ideally a student led campaign that improves public image of CSO's
 - x. Jin – improve CSO public image by coordinating with AS Media Group
