1. TBL Ad Hoc

Last week, TBL was funded \$12,190. Senate opened up the minutes because there was a 10% limit of the OSL fund Fall quarter.

Opening up the minutes is when legislative council thinks we broke financial policy they are allowed to open up the minutes. According to clause 6 any single organization should receive more than 10% quarterly.

Cindy: Opening it up to finance board for questions, the 10% rule is an interpretation for the Senate. What are you feeling like how you feel about the opening of the minutes. She wants

to make it transparent. How do you feel about no FB members were in the ad-hoc committee.

Raul: Met with the Ad-Hoc committee this morning to talk about the situation. They made a recommendation and wanted to see what the finance board thought about this.

Mayra: Senate was opened the FB board minutes, had come to agreement as TBL operations was most important for TBL because they came in last year and that's what they came. Minutes aren't open on purpose and there are action items to the

Raul: Intentions are important for the finance board.

Juan: The TBL and Sophia came in the meeting last week and explained what happened in the meeting to last years senate.

Raul: 10% clause came about just recently, the discussion that happened on the Senate, for the reasons of last years meeting, policy was broken but that wasn't the topic of their discussion.

 ${\bf Safa:}$ Is the 10% from the 90,000, when we fund OSL groups, this refers to all OSL groups.

Jose: The 10% clause isn't written correctly because it's vague. It's up to your interpretation as The Finance Board. Consider what it means when it reads "per event."

Also, Finance Board did discuss this allocation for two hours last week. You are the experts of financial policies.

Raul: 1. Define what the 10% means (believe is the 90,000 or 361+90,000)

Nicole: 10% rule should apply to two different internal lock-ins

Mayra: Bill in the table that will make the \$90,000 BCC will be able to ask from this budget.

Raul: 361 is only for BCCs

DJ: when we made the internal lock-ins we agreed that we would prioritize will still be supported, we also agreed that we were going to invest on The Bottom Line.

Mayra: ::reading the lock-in for unallocated::

Raul: 361 we can't move because it is only for OSL groups. Finance board unallocated is only BCC and OSL and AS unallocated (\$90,000) is only for OSL group.

Mayra: the concern is that do BCC come and ask for money from the pool of money. What kind of guarantee from where they can ask money from. That is a concern from the BCC.

Raul: The TBL funding is coming from the BCC/OSL Fund that is what we decided last week.

Cindy: AS unallocated has an account number part that wasn't allocated to anything it was left over to be given out throughout the year. Now that there is a lock-in fee there is money to give out.

Dwayne: We should go to the second part and see what we consider what The Bottom Line. **Raul:** Last week we allocated 12,190 for TBL. The number that was decided by the board. The ad-hoc recommendation was 6,900 came about that was Harrison Weber suggested last year. The suggestion from the ad-hoc was 7,300 for honoraria to TBL.

Jose: Between now and the Senate meeting, all FB members and Senate members should have a conversation about the semi-autonomous relationship between ASFB and AS Senate.
