As of 4/30 the CAB Foundation has \$6,438.25 to allocate

1. California Universities Recycling through Alliance

CAB has been announcing this program on the agenda in search of volunteers. The coordinator begar this program to save quality books from recycling to be donated to prisons. They need student volunteers to help categorize and stamp books as well as deliver them. The funds requested would help buy more books from old bookstores. They requested \$518.

2. Friends of the Forest Foundation
