## FOUNDATION MINUTES 5/21

Total funds left as of noon: \$1,705.25

1. Chi Delta Theta asked for funds up to \$300 for their "Carnival for Charity" event with proceeds going to the Isla Vista Teen Center. The funds provided by the CAB Foundation will go towards decorations or games supplies and rentals. Their total budget approximation is \$1,800. BWL motioned to give them \$300, the motion was seconded by CD. The Foundation decided unanimously to allocate \$300 to Chi Delta Theta.
2. The Students for the Advancement of Sports & Activities is hosting a waterpong tournament to benefit the International Child Cancer Fund. The event will provide UCSB students with fun sporting events and activities free of drug and alcohol. The group asked for \$575 to help alleviate costs in the total budget of \$1240. CD motioned to grant them the amount in full. The motion was seconded by KS. The Foundation determined unanimously to grant The Students for the Advancement of Sports & Activities \$575.
3. Direct Relief International asked the CAB Foundation for \$5,000 to help the estimated cost to implement a new site with a total budget of \$25,000. While Foundation members agree that Direct Relief International is a wonderful organization that outreaches to student volunteers, it is not really in the realm of allocations for the CAB Foundation. CZ motioned to donate \$200.25 to Direct Relief as a gesture, but to inform them of the reason of our decision. BWL seconded the motion, and it was unanimously voted on.

Total funds allocated: \$1075.25
