**Habitat Restoration Internships—Coal Oil Point Reserve**

What? UCSB's Coal Oil Point Reserve has four habitat restoration internships available for the Summer Quarter 2007. Interns will work with a habitat restoration ecologist, the Reserve Steward, other interns and volunteers assisting with restoring native wetland and coastal sage scrub habitats. Requires a 30 hour commitment, generally 3 hours/a week with occasional weekend time. Applicants must be available Friday mornings from 9am-noon beginning June 29<sup>th</sup>. \$250 stipend on successful completion. No experience is necessary but knowledge of native plants and restoration and ecology is a plus. Positions are funded by Wildlife Conservation Board and open to UCSB students only.
