I. Announcements

II. ADA Proposals

The following were possible proposals for the ADA Committee for the 2005-2006 school year.

- * Sponsor a conference with members from campus departments who are interested in disability-related issues. (e.g. a student in the geography department is doing research concerning individuals with disabilities.) James suggested we also raise funds from other local organization. The conference could also incorporate leadership training that addresses accommodating the needs of people with special needs. Leadership training is a key component to the success of students at this university.
- * We would like more adaptive technology products/licenses. DSP would like to have an adaptive technology lab in Embarcadero, as well as adaptive computers at CLAS (Campus Learning Assistance Services.) We would also like to obtain funding for a braille embosser which can produce graphics. (Many companies, including Apple and HP are willing to donate products to universities or at the very least, sell their products at reduced prices. We may want to check and see if vendors of adaptive equipment have similar policies.)
- * Have a coping coach for students with AD/HD students. DSP would also like to provide support for students suffering from bipolar disorder. (Overall support for those suffering from psychological disorders.
- * We would like funding to research the accessibility of buildings/transportation in our local community. DSP has already begun posting information about accessible restaurants, movie theaters, and transportation companies on their website. It would be great to provide prospective and current students with information about the accessibility of places in the local community.
