Leasing v Buying

Positives into purchasing a vehicle is that it won't be utilized too often and will last a while. Marisela is leaning more towards the latter option.

Insurance

Can we use TPS insurance? If we purchase? If we lease?

Services

Pricing

If we bought it through TPS, could we get a better price?

Parking

Where you can park it? Do we have to buy a spot? Donations from TPS?

Precedent

Are there are vehicles that are used by the University that are not leased?

Can we lease a particular vehicle for the first few trial months/year and then purchase the vehicle?

Will TPS let us choose vehicle or will they have us choose from a selection they provide?

Vehicle Types

Side v. Rear-Loading

Rear-loading can fit more passengers and up to two wheelchairs

Do we go for max seating in one van or do we want to remain under 10 passengers (avoid having to get a Class B license)

Quotes

Need to keep looking for quotes on vehicles, narrow down to a few (capacity, pricing, durability, gas milage)

Orientation

Jessie spoke to Orientation staff - deadline latest for orientation pamphlets is latest dead week \$70 for half a page and \$120 for a full page.

Very rarely transport students with mobility limitations rent out vehicles from TPS - don't look at driving records, no Class B (9-pass), not ADA compliant vans
