- Voting Items (Teal and Dunn)
  - o Cati

- Bowling Wednesday after meeting
  - Non-profit from Nicaragua
    - Competition for best project proposal to protect coastal ecosystems
    - NGO could get up to <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> million \$
    - Vote for it (women's empowerment objective)
    - Also monitoring endangered species
    - Will send out the link
    - Voting ends on February 2<sup>nd</sup>

## o Chang

- Strengthening the Roots
  - Have 8 people confirmed, not including CORE (except Natasha and Russ)
  - Registration is still open; fee goes up to \$25 after tonight
  - Not going to work on funding yet (until we know how many will come)
  - Paying for gas only
- Power Shift
  - Tiffany and Dunn asked for money from CAB (hopefully will know this week)
  - Want to finalize panel for selection process

- Proposal (Dunn): Dunn, Scott Bull, CAB rep (Amanda Galvin?), Katie Maynard (campus sustainability coordinator), Paul (AS president)
- Comments:
  - Evanne—Katie will have a hard time meeting, as she's traveling between here and NY
  - Corie—Dunn is only one from EAB on panel?
    - Dunn—could have more EAB members if we think fitting?
    - Corie—would be wise to have more EAB members for input (as to the people applying)
  - Tiffany—have Paul or Marge? (Marge is getting funding)
    - Trying to secure funding from EVPSA office, so could be an EAB rep as well
    - Dunn—Anthony is also funded, so could be on panel
  - Dunn—how many EAB members should we have on the panel?
    - Chang—add two EAB members (3/7 panel members)
      - Dunn—7 would be hard to put together
    - Cassie—have it be 2/5 panel members be EAB members
       Cati—seconded
      - Taylor—including past EAB?
        - Dunn—good to have people currently involved
    - Tiffany—we're putting the backbone for it, so we should have more input
      - Have 2 non-voting members on panel (for advisory)
    - Dunn—2 EAB, 2 staff, 1 other student from another organization
      - Natasha seconded
    - Corie—do the other orgs want someone on the panel?
      - Dunn-still don't know if they are funding us
    - Anthony—panel's job?

- Dunn—sift through applications, interviews are up in the air. Should we do interviews? Discuss in the future.
- Corie—anonymous applications, so EAB members wouldn't know about the EAB applicants
  - Anthony—can definitely tell through application
  - Natasha—interviews are a good idea, as it's very competitive
- Teal—nice to have interviews, as people on paper are not the same as how they can act
- Anthony—probably trying to appeal to mostly EAB members as they are the most proactive
- Tiffany—make sure to outreach to others as we are getting funding from outside sources
- Motion on table: 2 EAB reps, 2 staff reps, 1 other student rep
  - Corie—other EAB reps for advising?
    - Natasha—2 should be sufficient
    - Dunn—have to find 2 more people who don't want to go/are already funded
    - Tiffany—open it up to other orgs for board, have only 1 voting EAB, 2 advisory EAB
    - Corie—EAB has gotten funding because of environmental students, so we should be trusted to give the money to the most dedicated people
    - Natasha—feel that we need 2 EAB members, but don't need the advisory EAB members on top of that; unnecessary
    - Dunn—2 EAB members should be able to make the decision
- Motion on table: funding Dunn to Power Shift, and a panel composed of: 2 EAB CORE members (not applying for funding), 1 student from a funding group, 2 staff members
  - Anthony seconded

  - LRDP—comes up every 20 years, have to have an environmental impact report; SUN was aware of that
