- Budget
  - Needed to talk about projector and food for Fair Trade Fair.
- Voting Items (Teal and Dunn)
- Updates
- Officer check-ins:
  - o Dani
    - Talked to Brit about higher education week
      - Evanne—Ryland is also in contact with him
    - EENG is going well.
  - Evanne
    - Water working group
  - Daniel
    - CAB is going to Segwick reserve this Sunday
      - Volunteer work with Tom's field (pruning, etc.)
      - Limit of 20 people
      - Will have a sign up sheet at meeting on Wednesday depending on number of CAB attendees
      - 1:00-5:00PM
    - Will conflict with camping
      - Dunn—worried about camping because of the rain
    - S.T.R. was great
      - Russ—many good workshops, had a drum circle
        - o Fermentation, vegan soap-making, plastic bottle workshops
      - Dunn—many things were geared toward foods; some on outreach/publicity
        - Community Based Social Marketing workshop
          - Working with people's behaviors to inspire change
      - Ezzez—workshop on pesticides
        - Recently methyliodide was approved, a known neurotoxin/leeches into groundwater
        - o Local groups/N.P.O.s have stopped it from being used so far
        - Should do vegan soap-making with EAB
      - Russ—had an open-space workshop
    - Adopt-A-Block (pending rain) on Thursday at 2:00PM
      - Video people will be recording Adopt-A-Block this week
  - o Katie
    - Stepped down from EJ; now is rep and connection to Human Rights Board
    - Theme—make your purchase count; Fair Trade Fair, Tuesday, 11:00-2:00
    - EAB/SFC has its own table to make shirts
    - Wants to have food samples/volunteers help
    - Can we reimburse Evette for making food?
      - Brooke—SFC can reimburse Evette without it having to be voted on
      - Dunn—would SFC give money from their budget or budget within EAB?
      - Teal—they have a little bit of money left in their budget
    - By the SRB, across on the lawn
    - Dunn—assuming that we don't have money covered by SFC, as we don't have quorum, can someone pledge money from their account to cover Evette?
      - Brooke—sustainable foods can cover funds if need be
    - Teal—bring it up for vote next week

- Brooke
  - Natasha and Brooke are going to SLO green chef on Sunday to get ideas for spring
  - Will pay for gas themselves
  - No working group
- o Russ
  - Camping trip will be canceled, rain-pending
  - Dani—have a mud-sliding social?
    - Russ—yes, if can get help setting it up
    - March 5<sup>th</sup>—CORE social ropes course
- Cassie
  - TGIF grants due Monday
  - Mailboxes need to be painted
    - Teal—likes the wooden boxes, unpainted
    - Cassie—could put labels on boxes now
- o Alyssa
  - Meeting with dining commons/RHA tomorrow to schedule Green Monday in dining commons
  - Planning a Green Monday dinner party, night of March 5<sup>th</sup>
    - Coming up with a theme—Everything Green; South of the Border
  - Will have working group
- o Ezzez
  - Cora took Leafnotes over
- o Dunn—applications are in for Power Shift
  - Committee meeting on Wednesday
    - Review for a week afterward
  - Confirmation emails will come out soon
  - Will choose people for interviews for mid-scorers (top-scorers automatically in)
  - Are doing it anonymously
    - Ezzez—you'll know who people are by responses to questions
    - Will help look at it subjectively, and some panelists don't know the CORE officers
- o Cris
  - Sent in blog forms
  - Will be working on a general announcement for EAB for bike-path signs
  - Working on water competition posters with Beth (Graphic design artist)
  - Will be meeting with Islay to talk about budget to find out how much can give to SFC
  - Islay will work on publicity for Majora Carter
  - Need 10 more people to sign blog agreement forms
  - Ezzez—will make a folder for what EAB photos should be uploaded to the site
- Discussion
  - o 2011-2012 structure
    - Teal/Dunn—we need to consolidate CORE so it is more manageable. Core has gotten too large a group with votes, discussion, need set process
      - Wants to keep it to 20 CORE officers
      - Change name from chairs to coordinators for the officers (votes, gets honoraria)
      - Will also have liaisons (don't vote, no honoraria)

- o EENG, HRB, campus affairs, local affairs, leg council
- 14 coordinators (CORE officer group who takes care of business)
  - o 3 coordinator positions for 3 main topics—foods, business, EJ
    - Important subjects, long history—will happen every year
  - o 3 coordinator positions for 3 special projects
    - They can split up for 3 projects, combine and do 1 project, or work with 3 main coordinators on their projects
    - Will be flexible; can take on topics as needed
- Cassie—doesn't leg council have to be a voting member?
  - Dunn—Will be a voting member, but not have coordination duty
- Evanne—campus affairs chair shouldn't be a liaison position
  - Sits on multiple committees, close with other members
  - Liaison with entire campus, not a small group
  - Teal—officers put on events/etc., liaisons collaborate/communicate
    - o Evanne-An event coordinator with Ron Cortez
  - Should be a voting member
  - Dunn—size of group is hard to manage
    - o Liaisons can update group of happenings on campus
    - o More of a communicatory role, less investment
- Brooke—if special project coordinators take position, they need an idea
  - How will we frame position and requirements
  - Dunn—duty is putting on one big event per quarter; when running for position, has to present ideas of events
  - Teal—when running, have to demonstrate strong leadership
  - Evanne—could be an issue if no one is interested in a subject
    - o How do you make sure that certain running events keep running?
  - Alyssa—can you make each special projects coordinator have a focus?
  - Teal—if no one is interested in the project, then it won't work out very well; hence the special projects coordinators
  - Dunn—foods, business, EJ have taken effort to get implemented
- Cris—3 special projects coordinators, 9 projects
  - Each coordinator has 3 focuses—focuses on one a quarter (ex//green Mondays, art, water)
- Dunn—projects that should take whole year
- Emily—could running projects (ex//water, Green Mondays) fit under main coordinators?
  - That would save certain events from fizzling out by not having a chair assigned to them
- Cassie—if someone is not passionate about water, they won't have a good project resulting
  - Nice to have a requirement to have a big project a quarter; that way have inspiration of old projects but can choose a new one
- Ezzez—2 foods coordinators that can cover Green Mondays, garden, etc.
  - Education, art and water are the only project left that are not assigned to an officer
  - Shouldn't limit EAB
  - Say we have room for special projects coordinators if you want to join with an idea
  - Teal—by not limiting, it's difficult to manage all the officer positions

- o Art, green Monday, garden, green radio, etc.
- o Don't need to give them all titles
- Brooke—hold off on discussion until we have more people? Or do an email discussion?
  - Special project coordinators—what if someone doesn't step up?
  - Should water have a chair position? Art and historian could be the same position?
  - Green Monday can be under foods.
  - Water is a chair. No special project coordinators.
- Dunn—food, business, EJ
  - Showed that they are effective campaigns
  - Needs to see that water is a successful campaign year-by-year (too new to make a coordinator position)
- Cris—foods coordinator, for example, could delegate for Green Monday, garden, etc.
  - Lots of power in membership
  - Focus on delegating to members rather than creating special projects coordinators
- Teal—members feel like they are being updated in working groups rather than being involved
  - Special projects coordinators could be overseers of working groups created by general membership
  - Dunn—this could be an extreme switch to go from 28 to 18 in one year; could also cut it down by less
- Teal—email if you have strong opinions
  - Nice to let EAB fluctuate and do its thing as the time calls
  - Dunn—gives people a chance to come up with new ideas for working groups
    - o Ex//political lobbying, restoration, farmers' market bike rides, energy, etc.
