Dear Associated Student Leaders:

I am the faculty advisor of the Women in Computer Science (WiCS) group, and am also a Professor and the Vice Chair of the Computer Science Department. I am writing in regard to the issue that has come up with regard to their lack of registration as a student group in the 2008-09 year, and their request for \$250 in startup funds for that year. WiCS was founded in the 2007-08 year, and has been an active group ever since. We change officers at the beginning of each academic year. Unfortunately, it seems that there was some miscommunication last year between the outgoing and incoming officers that lead to our forgetting to register as a student organization for that year. This was completely an oversight, as WiCS has been and continues to be a very active organization. There are multiple events each quarter, which include a welcome potluck for our new students in the Fall, social events such as a bowling night, academic events such as meeting with female colloquium speakers in our department, and active recruiting of new graduate students.

To make the case for this request, I think it is important to include the history of this group. Nationally, women in Computer Science are a distinct minority. They make up approximately 20% of graduate students in MS and Ph.D. programs. Approximately 15% of Computer Science faculty are female. Through a concerted recruiting effort, the UCSB Computer Science department increased the percentage of female graduate students in our program from 19% to 24% in 2007. As a result of this success, we founded the Women in Computer Science group to academically and socially support these students and help ensure their retention. This organization is critical to the continued recruitment and retention of our female graduate student population. The group works to recruit newly admitted students to our campus, and also is an important academic support system for our current students. The group is invaluable in this effort and has become critical to our department. It is unfortunate that they had this miscommunication between outgoing and incoming officers about registering as a student group, but it was not from malicious intent. Because they believed they had money from last year's registration, they have already hosted a welcome dinner for the new graduate students and used part of this allocation. While they probably should have waited until the money was in hand before hosting the dinner, it is critical to have this welcome dinner in the second or third week of the quarter, before the new students become overwhelmed with coursework and are unable to attend their own welcome event.

In summary, I ask that ASSU please make an exception based on the importance of this organization and the fact that it was an oversight that they did not register last year. They have been a very active organization and I'm sure will continue to be so in the current year. Thank you for your consideration of this request.
