2. Black Student Union \$4612

Speaker: We're looking to celebrate Black History month, with various events through next month to support and show what black individuals have contributed to history. We'll be handing t-shirts out at a debate about affirmative action and other topics about black history, and we're going to create our own game with Black History taboo cards.

3. Black Student Union \$4370

Speaker: We're having our annual outreach program, which has been going on for the past two decades, we're going to bring underrepresented high school kids to a new environment, the university, and teach them the requirements and application process to attend a UC. We received \$10,000 from SIOP, this request is for what hasn't already been funded. We've tried to keep it as cheap as possible, but the hotels we need to book are \$110 a night for the chaperones.

4. EEMB Graduate Symposium \$500

Speaker: This will be our fifth annual symposium, started because we realized the EEMB department is very large, and we didn't know what many of our colleagues were doing for their work, so this is a day for graduate students to share and present their work. Will be on Saturday, February 7, attendance is open to all, and this is has been a good basis to bring in perspective graduate students, and about 12 or so undergraduates come, with total of 100 graduate student. We're just asking for \$500 to defray the catering costs for

the dinner at the end of the day.

Speaker: We are putting on a Mardi Gras Madness party this Saturday at 9pm at the Hub. We have some changes to the budget that we submitted: we're not doing flyers, we're changing the decoration cost to \$100. We're renting the helium tank. Miscellaneous is streamers and string for balloons. We're expecting 200-300 people to the party.

7. Investment Advisory Committee \$100

Dan: This is an Action item, has been misprinted. We'll discuss it later.

8. Sex and Relationships Internship \$1813.86

Speaker: Asking for funding for Sexual Responsibility Week, which is a national event with the goal to educate the campus to lower risky sexual behavior and give people tools to help have healthy sexual relationships, and promote the use of latex barriers for sexual activities.

9. Model United Nations \$5000.00

Darshan: We're requesting funds from the academic teams budget to attend the world championships in The Hague in the Netherlands, we attended last year in Mexico and was the most successful UC delegation on a world stage, we were invited again this year because of our performance last year. We're only able to send 10 delegates this year, as limited by championship rules, will cost about \$1300 per person, and we're just requesting money for transportation costs.

10. STAR \$2199.35

Speaker: We're requesting money for our event Safe Spring break, to teach students how to be safe and take care of their friends during spring break. The temporary tattoos say "Kiss me, I'm a sober driver", I don't know about the break down for the other things. The t-shirts are sweatshop free, by Julie's Silk Screening which is my mom's business and I'm going to be doing a lot of the work of screening them.

Speaker: Want to put on a Winter Nights program to give students a chance to talk with professors on controversial issues in an informal environment, the issue will be introduced by Prof. John Baldwin, on the question of whether UCSB students have a raging sexuality. Chose the faculty club because of its environment and the food that they prepare.

14. UCSB Wellness Program \$1245.12

Speaker: Looking for funding of Random Acts of Kindness Day, we're trying to promote being positive and proactive, asking everyone to spread kindness to make their day a bit better. We won't be giving away the t-shirts unless they participate.

15. Men Against Rape \$2598.12

Speaker: Most people feel like they are against sexual assault, we can help make this less of a problem and change society. Having Walk the Walk program from February 23-26, to ask people to do little things to stop sexual assault, if you sign a pledge you get a sweatshop free, organic t-shirt.

16. HEAL \$3100

Speaker: We're asking for funding for a National Eating Disorder Awareness week, we're trying to get the director of the documentary "America the Beautiful" on February 21 at 6pm, which is about how media distorts society's views about beauty, to talk at a screening of this movie. We're going to hand out t-shirts to the first 120 students if they make a pledge.

17. Chicana/o Latina/o Graduation Committee \$18,968.50

Speaker: Since 1974, we've put on an alternate ceremony to recognize the unique struggles of the Chicano/a community, as well as family and community members. We're planning on having it on Saturday, June 13 at 11:30am, it won't conflict with the traditional university commencements, it includes entertainment and speakers which is relevant to our heritage. What we need funding for the most is for the cultural performance and the event rentals, the event rentals are the most time sensitive. The DVDs are going to be sent out to the students, which is filmed by a professional.

18. INDUS \$4000

Speaker: Asking for funding to put on South Asian Awareness Week, February 17-20, will be putting on a documentary to raise awareness about our campus's South Asian community and as a way to start talking about taboo subjects in our culture on the 18th. Will have a sari workshop and teach a dance routine on the 19th, and have a taboo talent

show on the 20th. The proposed flyer budget needs to be cut in half, and we're only planning on putting two adds in the Daily Nexus instead of three.

19. Cotillion Dance Club

Speaker: I have two events I'm asking for funding. First I have the budget for an international standard workshop series that we are putting on, taught by the former world champion in ballroom dance Nigel Clarke, which are open for free, and started last Thursday. Second event is for a social dance for the club, have proposed to have it on February 7th from 8-11pm at the SRB, which will be free and open to everyone. We haven't tried to go to After Dark for funding.

20. NORML

Speaker: We're asking for funds to have a film screening at 1940 Buchanan Hall for three hours, we're trying to make this a fund raising event for our club like our last screening and are planning on selling DVDs of the movie, film posters, and silk screened hemp shirts. We're trying to get the director of the movie AKA Tommy Chong, which is about a drug paraphernalia company owner who was entrapped and prosecuted. We're requesting a total of \$2448 for the event.

Desi: I just called them and they said they were going to use this dance to fundraise to pay for their debt for what they spend on their graduation ceremony last year, but when I told them they would only get funded if this was a philanthropic event, they said they would have their proceeds go to the Victor Hughes Foundation to stop hate crimes. It

would be good to table them.

Bee withdraws her motion.
