Summer issue – hoping to print 3000 copies with different design style and larger magazine. Met with Jeff Linger from Master Plan agency, talked about different ways the Master Plan could help the community besides furthering business and housing opportunity. County owns 7-foot corridor from Sam's to Go to Chino's. Word Magazine received approval to use this area for magazine circulation and art-related purposes. Ultimate plan is to put a wall on the street that has community artwork on it. It will be a "mini space" for people to come and relax and observe this "micro-gallery." It will have a chalkboard so the space is interactional. Voices concern for the very little public artwork in IV. It would promote community because it's a public space/installation where people could come and share common interests. Requesting \$227 for materials and 20 hours of work at \$10 an hour **Grand Request Total=\$427**

Area will have an easel for public thoughts, and a box for distributing issue. Hoping that this space could last for the entire summer. Jeff voices concerns about this turning into a "mini skate park." County has never worked with student organizations in art-related projects, Brian views this as a "mini-test" on behalf of the County.
