PUBLIC FORUM

Yolanda Garcia – She wanted to introduce the Student Affairs staff members. They work with different departments: Office of International Student Affairs, Child Care Services, CLAS, Educational Opportunity Program, Counseling and Career Services, Disabled Students Program. The CLAS director announced her retirement. Yolanda is Co-chair for the new Student Resource building, which will be ready in December.

Gary White – He is from the Disabled Students Program. The program helps students with visible and invisible disabilities, move through their academic careers. They provide academic accommodation such as notetaking, alternate text, test accommodation.
