What is a liaison?

"Communication or cooperation which facilitates a close working relationship between people or organizations." (Oxford dictionary)

How does it relate to you?

You all play a role in the creation of that relationship

 Good communication from both parties can result in better representation, a collaborative working relationship, and an Association culture that values teamwork.

QUESTION #2:

What are the qualities of a good Senate Liaison? What are the qualities of a good entity?

What are the responsibilities of a Senate Liaison?

- Hold office hours
- Sit on a variety of BCU's, Committees, or hold Senate leadership positions.
- Have the power of Legislative initiative with the consent and cooperation of the BCU
- Report events and actions by the BCU to Senate
- Report all legislation the senate is voting on, and other actions by the Senate
- Maintain regular contact with the BCU
- Attend 50% of the BCU meetings

What is the role of the BCU chair?

- Hold office hours
- Communicate issue, events, and updates to the Senate liaison
- Attend Senate quarterly to give reports
- Maintain regular contact with their Senate liaison
- Work with the Senate liaison regarding legislation that is pertinent to the entity.
